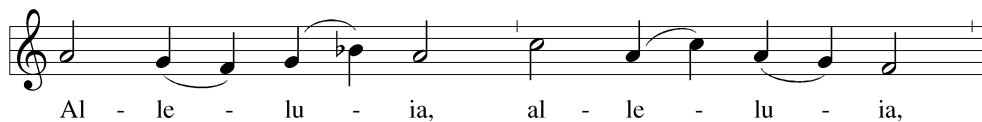
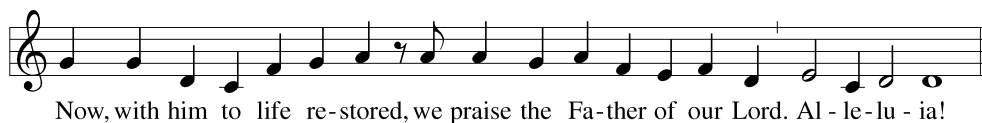
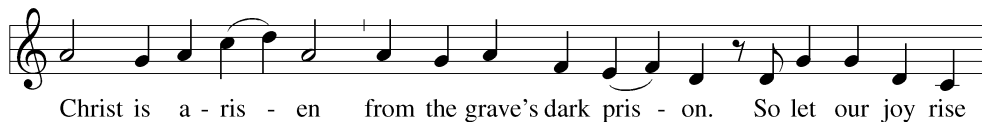
## SECOND READING: Colossians 3:1–4
